Feel what it is like on the moon. What does it look like? Remember to check your air is working and you are making a giant leap for those on Earth.


Put our countries flag on the moon. Remember you are on T.V, all around the world, in every country you could think of.

This week is Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori Language week which is celebrated nation wide. We started the week by meeting in the hall, where Matua Heta led us in waiata and karakia. He then taught us a phrase, encouraging conversation between teacher and child. Each day, we have a different phrase to practice. At breaks, Matua plays the guitar outside while children perform. He started with the Potiki team, who were so proud and so 'loud'. In classes, teachers are focusing on legends as well as intructions, counting, phrasing, and greetings in te reo.

Our Māori staff, Jimmy Heta, Ngahuia Cooper, Adrianne Stensness, Vic Rangitaaawa and Aretopa Te Tomo have been reading to classes. The books, provided by the Ministry of Education, are written in te reo with the English translation. We are exceptionally lucky to have five staff who can speak clearly to our children using te reo.
