






#### Dear Mrs Cleaver

This week at school we are celebrating Pink Week, which helps to raise an awareness of bullying. Our focus this year is what it means to be a kind friend. Teachers will be on the look out for those children who are being a kind friend to others and they will receive a kind friend card. Each team has a pink box in the office where the children can put their kind friend cards. The teams will have a team assembly on Friday where 4 names will be drawn out of the box. These children will receive a watch that has been kindly donated by Mr Frampton, Danica Howe's father. When someone says or does something intentionally hurtful and they keep doing it 'over time' when you tell them to stop, or show them that you're upset that's BULLYING!
